Lee Apartments Choice Neighborhoods Initiative**

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CHOICE NEIGHBORHOOD INITIATIVE (CNI) RESIDENT SURVEY RESULTS

The Kingsport Housing & Redevelopment Authority (KHRA) has received a grant to help plan for the revitalization of the Midtown Neighborhood, which includes the Robert E. Lee Apartments. The Choice Neighborhood Initiative (CNI) is a competitive federal grant from HUD aimed at strengthening and rebuilding communities with public housing properties.

Introduction and Summary

This report presents the results of a survey which collected information needed to help KHRA plan the revitalization of the neighborhood and the Lee public housing site. It assesses many things in order to respond to housing preferences, relocation needs, and job training needs, barriers to obtaining sustainable employment, health needs, child education needs, and your ideas for the design of replacement housing. Heads of households were encouraged to complete the survey.

The survey was performed in early 2013 and the analysis completed July 2013. The survey consisted of 121 interviews out of a total of 122 total units; a survey rate of 99 percent. The categories of the survey analysis consist of a general overview/demographics, economic self-sufficiency, relocation, education, health, and participation under the categories of neighborhood crime and safety, transportation, supportive services, family health, early childhood and youth, adults, and seniors. These areas focus on the people vision and criteria described in the 2012 CN Implementation NOFA.

Summary of findings and conclusions:

- General:

Approximately one half of household members are between the ages of 19 and 49. One in four is of early childhood age (0-5 years old) and approximately one in five are children age 6-18. Seniors make up nearly 1 in 10 households, and roughly one in seven heads of household are age 62 or older.

Over two thirds of head of households are female, and of all heads of household just over one half are single, and one in ten is widowed. Nine out of ten households do not count a Veteran in their ranks.

Desired outdoor facility improvements for the neighborhood in order of priority are:

- Barbeque grilles with picnic area
- Parks with seating areas
- Attractive landscaping
- Community garden

Regarding interest in serving on a CNI focus groups, only one in four responded yes. Of those with an interest in participating, the following focus groups were most often selected:

- Education
- Health
- Housing
- Youth

- Education:

For each adult in the household respondents were asked to report their highest level of educational attainment. Nearly two in five reported having a high school degree or GED; one in twenty reported a college degree as highest attained; with 1 in 30 having a graduate or professional degree.

Two in five children were enrolled in a pre-school program. One in twelve are in childcare; one in three are enrolled in head start; one in four are enrolled in Pre-K and child care.

The top reasons preventing enrollment in pre-school are:

- Cost (one in four)
- Lack of transportation (nearly one in four)
- Availability of adults at home (over one in five)
- Do not trust the provider (nearly one in five)

Better than nine in ten respondents are happy with the school their children are attending and had met their children's teachers. The most important education opportunities or programs that heads of household would like to see their children receive are:

- Computer skills
- Better learning of core subjects
- Home economics
- Art, music, and extra-curricular activities
- Vocational skills

- Health:

Household Health

More than three in five of respondents replied that they are in good health, while the same amount reported someone in the house smokes regularly. More than one half reported someone in the household dealing with a prolonged medical illness and over one in three reported depression in adults. More than three out of four had a physical exam or preventative medical care. Nearly three out of four have a doctor or clinic they visit when they were sick. One in four reported no exercise or activities to elevate their heart rate. Nearly four in five do not have a dentist.

More than one in four reported lack of insurance or coverage as a barrier to accessing medical and dental providers.

Children and Youth Health

Nearly all respondents reported their children and youth to be in good health and all reported their children having health insurance, and nearly all youth covered.

For those children and youth who have health insurance all are covered through the combined TENNCare/Medicaid program.

Adult and Senior Health

Almost three in five adults reported being in good health, while less than two in five seniors reported the same. When asked about their “present work status”, nearly one in four adults responded that they are permanently disabled. Half of all seniors reported needing assistance with general care activities at least occasionally.

- Economic self-sufficiency:

Approximately one in three adults is unemployed. Less than one in ten respondents reported being employed full time and 1 in 23 are employed part time. Nearly one in five are attending school full or part time.

Difficulties faced by respondents to work, attend school and participating in job training are as follows: Nearly one in six are disabled; approximately one in ten lack skills, have a child under age four, or lack affordable childcare.

Wage income was reported by one in ten respondents as an income source. The top four reported income sources were all through social programs (Social Security, SSI, WIC, and TANF). Of those who responded “Other”, over three in five reported Food Stamps. Less than one in fourteen participate in KHRA's Family Self Sufficiency (FSS) program.

The highest current job skills reported are food service, retail clerks, computer and data-entry, and customer service. 47 adults expressed an interest in job training program, with health care being the most desired (one in ten), followed by computer and data entry training, social services, and city employee job training.

- Relocation preferences:

Of the households surveyed nearly two in six desires to move temporarily to another PH site and then move back onsite or move permanently with a Section 8 voucher. Nearly one in eight desire to become homeowners.

- Safety:

More than three out of four respondents reported feeling safe in their neighborhood. More than one third reported the level of crime as being “Not a problem”, and less than one third as

“Tolerable”. Less than one in ten reported crime as being “Serious” and one in eighteen as “Increasing”. More than one third saw no change in the level of crime in the neighborhood over the last year, while one in seven reported an increase and just over one in ten a decrease in the level.

- Seniors:

Of the senior households surveyed, nearly one in three reported sickness and not feeling well as a barrier to participation in more social activities. Approximately one in five reported transportation and physical mobility challenges. Nearly one in six reported no problems to social activity participation.

Two in five reported that seniors or disabled in the household usually access services by rides from friends and family. One in five walked, and one in eight usually uses a special van or bus service. One in fourteen usually relied on public transportation or drove themselves. None reported a neighbor taking them where they need to go.

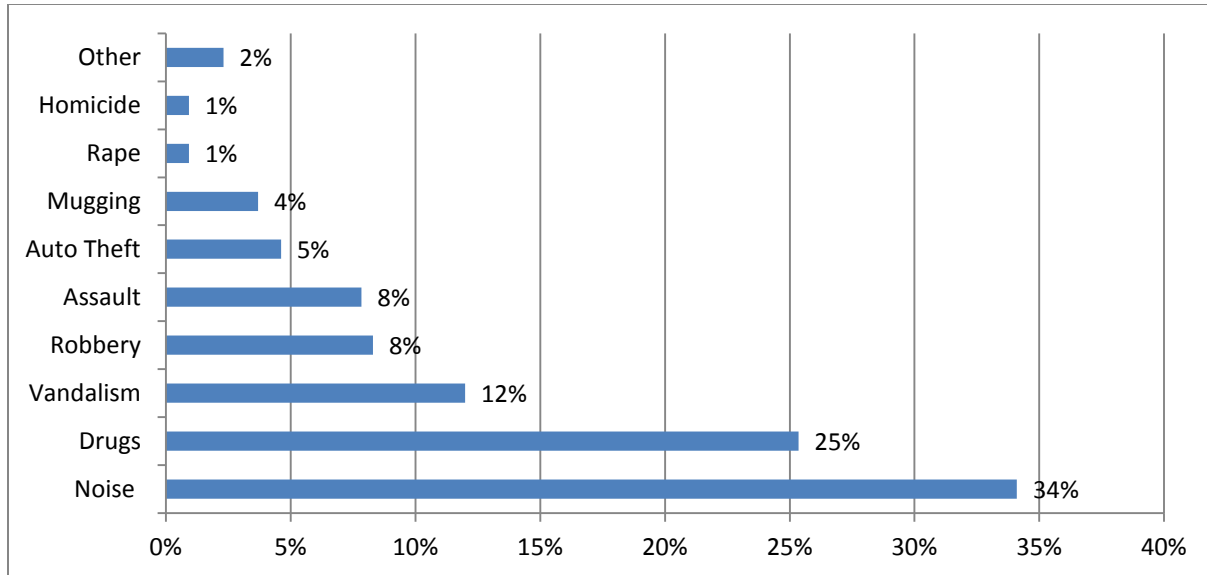


22. How has the level of crime in your neighborhood changed in the past year?

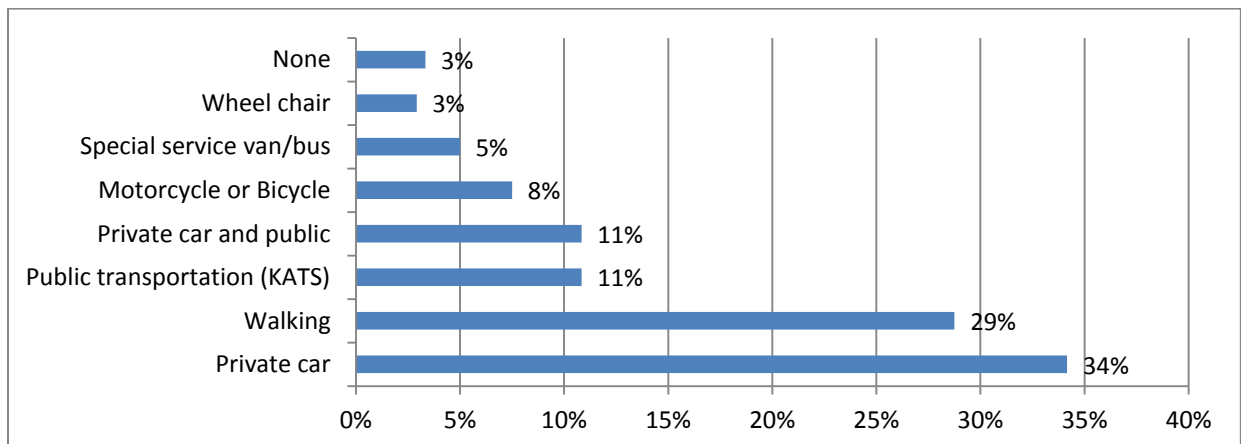

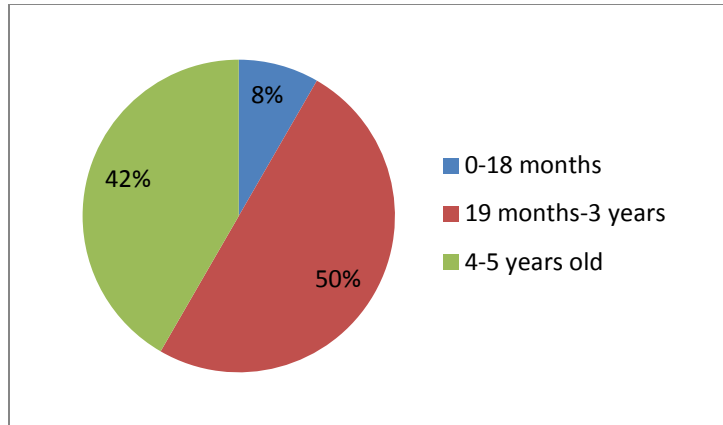

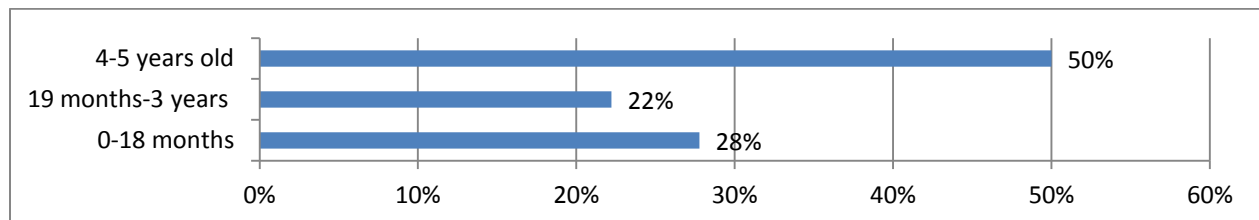

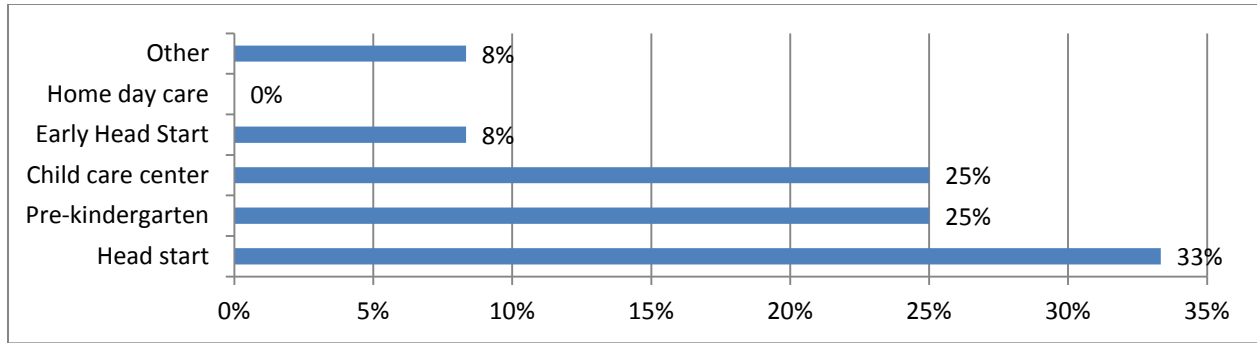

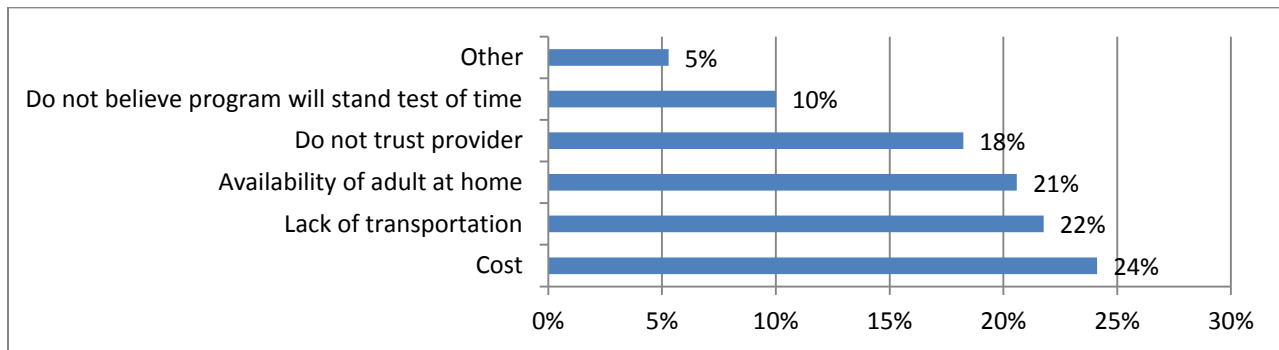
Composition of those enrolled:
