

**TRANSPORTATION FOCUS GROUP AGENDA  
SEPTEMBER 2013**

1. Confirm Outcome: Improved access to neighborhood transportation for education, health, jobs, replacement housing, supportive services, food, pharmacy and banking. Increased public transportation, walking and biking choices for all age groups including the disabled.
  
2. Confirm Metrics:
  - a. *Number and percentage of people by age group and disabled who rely on public transportation, walking and bicycle.*
  - b. *Type and number of transportation choices for Lee Apartments residents, public housing residents temporarily and permanently relocated from Lee Apartments, and those living in the target neighborhood.*
  - c. *Number and percentage of people reporting inability to access public transportation within one-half mile of their start and end points.*

4. Status of Additional Data to be Collected: Traffic data for major streets; walking and bicycling data; sidewalk condition survey and map;
  
5. Review Data Already Collected: Resident needs survey; KATS data; Transportation map; Transportation discussions from other FGs: Seniors, Health, Education, Youth.

6. List of Existing Gaps: inputs from youth, education, health and senior focus groups on transportation needs; park bench and bus shelter locations (sponsors to pay for installation); transportation access to off-site activities; funding to extend service hours on evenings and weekends; KATS meeting with Lee residents; free service for veterans; improve existing walkway from Lee to downtown; business survey.
  
7. Review best practices: *Transit Route Locations*: 14 pages sent before meeting. *MEOC Senior Transportation Program* – 1 page; *Bedford Ride Volunteer Program* – 1 page;
  
8. Brainstorm and Prioritize Potential Strategies: Need easel, newsprint pad, tape and pens to facilitate discussion.
